	entitled: THE WORLD WE LEAVE THEM. Greta Thornberg's cry to all who will hear is:	
	HOW DARE YOU!! The younger generation, mostly Millennials, are crying to be	
	involved in the decisions that will impact their futures With all this going on and our current political situation, there is a lot being asked of us	
	and WHO WILL ANSWER THE CALL? There are a lot of causes to work upon for those	
	who are immersed in our community. Our challenge is to figure out what we can do	
	that will affect and impact our youth population. I am sure we each have our stories and solutions. I want to elicit your ideas and proposals!
